

Municipality of the County of Victoria Employment Opportunity Water Utility Operator

The Municipality of the County of Victoria has an opening for a water utility operator for the operation of water supplies in communities within the Municipality. These supplies consist of small ground water systems and one small surface water conventional chemical treatment system. The supplies provide treatment, distribution and storage requirements to approximately 500 households in Victoria County. The position is for full time employment, with benefits and is subject to probationary review.

The ideal applicant will possess water operator certification and experience. Applicants that can demonstrate aptitude and related experience will be considered. The successful applicant must be willing to work toward obtaining Class I and Class II water certification. The water utility operator will be required to perform maintenance and repairs on all aspects of small water systems, this includes, pumping, treatment and distribution, ensuring all regulatory requirements are met.

Applicants must hold a valid drivers' license. You may be required to complete a skills test. Proof of certifications and licenses are required at time of employment.

Pay and benefits are competitive and are established through the CUPE Local 2694 Collective Agreement. Hours of work are based on a minimum 40-hour work week.
